Who Is Supporting Stormwater Legislation?

- State (2019 only)
 - SB505 CF Sen Elfreth. Environmental Violations Reporting Requirements
 - HB 410 CF Del Impallaria. Task Force on Prohibiting Debris From Entering Storm Drains or Stormwater Into Inlets
 - HB190 Del Laffety. Environment Failing On-Site Sewage Disposal System Definition
- County (2015 present)
 - 96-18 Trumbauer. Floodplain Management, Erosion and Sediment Control, and Stormwater Management – allows for the assessment of civil fines for certain erosion and sediment control violations outside of the critical area. Defeated
 - 83-15 CE. Erosion and Sediment Control Plans and Permits. Amend definitions, define certain terms, add new requirements, etc. Passed
 - 104-15 Trumbauer. Stormwater Mgt Coal Tar Pavement Products. Prohibition sale & use, establish penalties, etc. Passed
- City of Annapolis (2019 only)
 - R-46-18 Alderman Arnett. Application of the City of Annapolis Stormwater Regulations. Meet more than min requirements – New Developments & Restoration. Passed

Stormwater Activities Planning

What are the Key Stormwater Issues?

- Candidate Issue Criteria (proposed)
 - □ A change in Code and/or Policies is necessary and possible
 - □ Satisfies one or more goals of member organizations
 - □ Follows through on recommendation(s) made in Reports
 - □ Required expertise and/or resources are available
 - □ Benchmarking example(s) are available
 - □ Political support is necessary and likely
 - □ Complexity/level of effort/timeline can be reliably estimated
 - □ There is a committed volunteer lead/co-lead
 - **Other**

Key Issue Candidate – Example 1 Stormwater Advisory Committee (SAC)

- Citizen Council that might:
 - Review policies
 - Hear appeals and decide on violations, fee credits, service charges and adjustments
 - Evaluate capital and operational programs and budgets
 - Make recommendations to elected officials
- Modeled after Mecklenberg County SAC
- Replaces inactive AAC Stormwater Fee Advisory Council
- Takes advantage of recent appointment of AAC Environmental Policy Director

Key Issue Candidate – Example 2 Stormwater Maintenance Bond

- Both Public and Private stormwater BMPs/conveyance systems accepted from developer w/o maintenance bond
 - Public Works Agreement two-year maintenance bond w/possibility of one-year extension
 - Reforestation Agreement two year maintenance bond
- CE Pittman and I&P Stormwater Work Group have recommended a bond
 - No draft legislative language yet shared
 - Many issues on what maintenance actions would be required, role of HOAs, follow-on punch lists/inspections, etc
- Has relevance to COMAR Title 11-110
- Public should be involved

Key Issue Candidate – Example 3 AAC Inspection Program Review

- A properly resourced, objective, and transparent inspection program is essential to achieving SWM goals
 - Inspectors spread across I&P & DPW, public and private systems, development & post development
 - Ratio of inspection requirements to inspectors is high
 - Questions raised about inspector expertise/consistency
 - Database required in 2009 GDP is not yet complete
 - No consolidated, recurring review of inspection results
 - Inspection program below potential to improve SWM
- Changes needed in Code, Stormwater Management
 Practices and Procedures Guide, Budget, and Training
- New I&P leadership presents opportunity for change
